


## INDIANA CHEER CHAMPIONSHIP

POINT DEDUCTION SHEET



## **Obvious Bobbles/Mistakes (0.5 point):**

Obvious mistakes are those the audience could see. Deductions are given when an error draws the audience's eye and detracts from the effect of the routine.

Examples: hand(s) down on tumbling; obvious missed skills; shaky stunts/pyramids; incomplete twisting cradles; memory mistakes involving obvious execution of incorrect moves; etc.

- Balance checks when stunting are NOT a deduction. A top person losing their grip and dropping their foot from a body position IS a deduction.

Deductions for boundary violations will be taken only if there is not an immediate attempt to return to the competition boundary.
Deductions for inadvertently stepping on props will be taken at the judge's discretion.

## Major Mistakes (1.5 points):

Major errors during technical skills. Examples: drops from individual stunts; drops during tumbling skills; illegally inverted top person (at judge's discretion) - Deductions for obvious occurrences of stepping on props will be taken at the judge's discretion.

## Major Falls (2.5 points):

Major falls during technical skills or other obvious severe mistakes. Examples: multiple falls in a single sequence/series by a single structure, pyramids that fall or are severely missed
